- According to the Department of Defense there are 700 military child development program facilities around the world; with approximately 155,000 child-care paces, and another 3,000 Family Child Care homes.

- The average military family moves three times more than their civilian counterpart.

How Does BAH Work?

As we move into the active PCS season, we want to take moment to remind our active duty residents how your Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) funds are applied and paid.

The Military pays your Housing Allotment in conjunction with your pay—for work you did do, not work you will be doing. On 1 May, your LES should reflect pay statement ending 30 April.

That is why when an active duty family moves in, they are responsible for the prorate from the day of move in until the end of the month. The military pays the family back via allotment to the family that is theirs to keep as long as the account is paid in full.

Going forward, all active duty tenants will see a rolling balance on their resident portal. Rents for all of our residents are applied at the beginning of the month, but for those active duty tenants we are paid the 1st of the following month.

At move out, the allotment for rent is turned off after we receive funds the first of the following month as your rent is paid from an end of month allotment. The military pays for the days you were in the home, not days you will be in the home. So when funds are received the first of the month, it pays for the month prior.

Our corporate accounting team will go through and process and make adjustments to any BAH funds received after move out. Depending on your family's move out date, you will receive any refund due to your family in either the form of a check, or direct pay to your end of month LES.

Moving Soon? The Notice to Vacate Process

Are you and your family moving soon? If so, please remember you must provide Air Force Academy Military Communities (AFAMC) a written 30-Day Notice to Vacate and a copy of your Orders if applicable. If not, you will be financially responsible to fulfill a 30 Day Notice to Vacate.

Where can you get a 30 Day Notice to Vacate? You can visit AFAMC's website at www.airforceacademyhousing.com and download the 30 Day Notice to Vacate form or we will accept a written 30 Day Notice to Vacate on any piece of paper as long as it states your full name, current address, telephone number, date you wish to vacate your home, and your signature. NOTE: An email is NOT a valid 30 Day Notice to Vacate.

How can you submit a 30 Day Notice to Vacate and a Copy of your Orders to AFAMC? There are three (3) different ways to submit:

- Deliver your Notice to Vacate and a copy of your Orders if applicable to the Community Management Office,
- Scan a PDF file of the 30 Day Notice to Vacate with a copy of your Orders if applicable to afacontact@huntcompanies.com or;
- Email afacontact@huntcompanies.com and a 30 Day Notice to Vacate will be sent to you for signature via DocuSign

What if you cannot give a valid 30 Day Notice to Vacate because of short notice Orders? Short notice Orders are when you receive official Orders not allowing you to give the required written 30 Day Notice to Vacate. As long as you provide a Notice to Vacate in writing, copy of your Orders, letter from your Commander validating the Orders, and are approved by the Community Manager and/or Community Director you will not be held financially responsible to fulfill a full 30 Day Notice to Vacate.

Bear Aware

One of the best things about living in the mountains is the interaction we get to have with wildlife. However, it is also very important we do our part as we get into the spring to ensure we are providing a safe co-existing habitat for both our residents and our wildlife neighbors – including bears.

Here are a few fun facts about some Colorado bears:

- Black bear is a species; the color can actually range from black, blonde, or more brown.
- A bear's natural diet is grass, berries, fruits, nuts, and plants.
 If resources are low, they will seek other sources of food.
- A bear's nose is 100 times more sensitive than a human; allowing them to smell food up to 5 miles away.
- The average timeframe for bear activity in Colorado is mid-March to early November.
- Bears remember their food sources, which drives them to come back for more when they find it.
- Between late summer and early fall, a bear needs to consume 20,000 calories a day to prepare their body for the upcoming winter hibernation.
- Black bears are naturally shy, but follow their stomach to find food.

Black bears have been in Colorado long before humans. Every year the black bear population have to adapt to more people while still following their natural instincts for food. We ask your help with the following as we co-habit with our wildlife this summer.

- Do not intentionally leave food out for bears.
- Do not put bird feeder(s) out. Bird feed is made of nuts and are a natural food source for bears.
- Do not leave food, coolers, or air fresheners with a strong scent in your car or in an open garage.
- Do clean you barbeque pits and burn off food regularly.
 Cooked meat smells good for us and if actively looking for food, can smell really good to a bear who is hungry.
- Do keep all easily accessible windows and doors closed.
- Do ensure to take all trash out to your designated bins and not left in entryways to homes, open garages, or by your back door

Monthly Maintenance Tip Corner

Save some for the fish! Water conservation is the most cost-effective and environmentally sound way to reduce our demand for water. Here are some helpful tips for you and your family:

- Never pour water down the drain where there may be other uses for it, like watering a plant
- Run the dishwasher and washing machine only when fully loaded
- Avoid over watering your lawn and plants
- Use a broom to clean off your driveway and sidewalk instead of the watering hose
- Position sprinklers to water the lawn and shrubs and not paved areas, the fence or the home exterior
